What have we been up to this week?

This week we have introduced our children to their new nursery environment which is situated in our school's nursery. Both Alby Tots and St Albert's Nursery remain separated by a waist height wall and still have their own outdoor play areas. However, Alby Tots children will go into the school nursery for 15 minutes per day to have their snack. We are hoping this will encourage a smooth transition when Alby Tots children turn three and go into our school nursery as they will already know the nursery environment and will be familiar with the nursery teachers.

Alby Tots Uniform

We encourage all children who attend Alby Tots to wear our Alby Tots uniform so that we can distinguish our children around school. Wearing the jogging bottoms and polo t-shirts are also a lot more comfortable for the children to wear while playing in the nursery.

Alby Tots uniform is a yellow polo shirt which is sold in our school office for £3, navy blue jogging bottoms and navy blue jumper/cardigan. We do get very messy and play outdoors in all weathers so we prefer that children do not wear their own clothes as may get messy.
