

Tropic of Cancer	Is an imaginary line above the equator where the sun is overhead on June 21st.					
Tropic of Capricorn	Is an imaginary line below the equator where the sun is overhead on December 21st.					
Latitude	Distance of a place north or south of the earth's equator.					
Longitude	Distance of a place east or west of the Greenwich meridian.					
Biomes	Plants and animals that have common characteristics for the environment they exist in.					
Food Miles	The distance food is transported from the time of its production until it reaches the consumer.					
Reared	Animals raised or bred for their use, or for pleasure or for profit, often for food.					
Processed Food	Any food that has been altered in some way during preparation.
