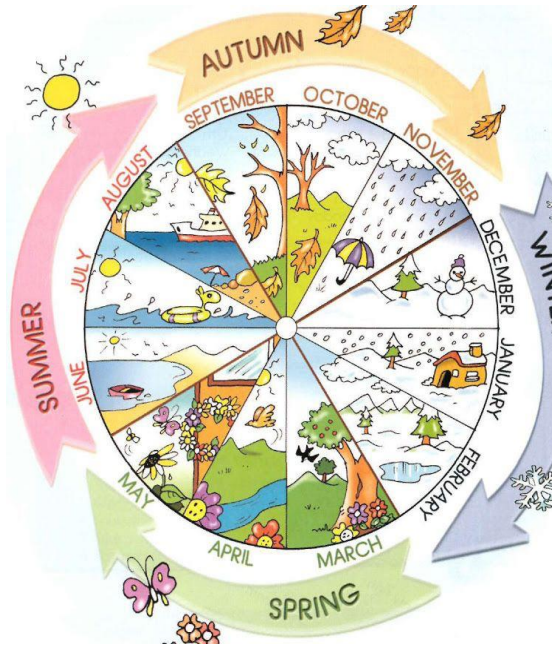

Definition

Equator	The equator is an imaginary circle around the Earth. It divides the Earth into two equal parts: the Northern Hemisphere and the Southern Hemisphere.
Ocean	An ocean is a huge body of salt water.
Season	The seasons are four different times during the year with different types of weather.
Weather	The weather is the daily state of the atmosphere.
Continents	A continent is a large solid area of land.
Country	A land controlled by a single government.
Island	Land surrounded by water.
