She married **Albert in February 1840**.

Queen Victoria had **four sons and five daughters**. In total she had **9 children!**

Queen Victoria ruled a huge empire. The Empire included the following countries – **New Zealand, Canada, South Africa and India**. Islands such as **Jamaica and Barbados** were in the British Empire too. Victoria was queen of the **biggest empire in history!**

Queen Victoria was the longest reigning monarch until the 9th of September 2015, now Queen Elizabeth II is the longest reigning monarch.
