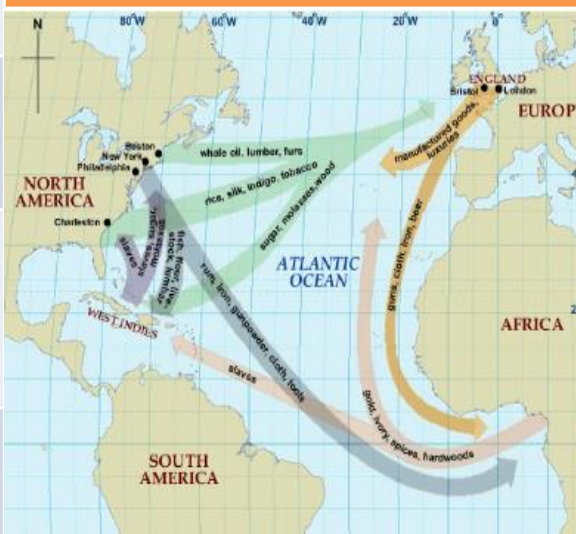


Vocabulary	Definition:
Slave	A person who is the legal property of another and is forced to obey them.
Slavery	People are treated like property, so they can be owned, bought and sold.
Enslaved	To make somebody a slave.
Freedom	The power or right to act, speak or think as you want.
Plantation	Place where crops are grown, such as coffee, sugar and tobacco.
Abolished	Formally put an end to something.
Shackles	A device used to restrain somebody, similar to handcuffs.
Transatlantic slavery	Crossing of slaves across the Atlantic Ocean, between Europe and Africa or America.
Dysentery	An infection that causes diarrhoea, stomach pains and a fever.

- Take 5 (Key Learning):**
1. The Atlantic slave trade was the selling of African people as slaves.
 2. Approx 12 million people were enslaved.
 3. Liverpool was a major port for the slave trade.
 4. Slaves were tightly packed on ships which could carry between 350 - 600 people.
 5. Disease spread easily and many slaves died during the journey.



Key Knowledge

Slavery had existed for many years before the Atlantic slave trade.

The Atlantic slave trade involved the forced enslavement of Africans, who were sent to America and Europe.

Slaves were made to work without wages in often terrible conditions.

The trade was at its height during the **18th century**.

Slaves worked to produce **sugar** with others producing **tobacco**, **coffee** or **cotton**.
