PSE

Provision:

- 1. Provide toy teacups and plates etc. for a toy's tea party like Little Red Riding Hood is having in the story.
- 2. Make a card for your friend and deliver it to them.

Adult-led:

- 3. Circle time game pass a small Santa toy around the circle. Can the children say what they would like to get for Christmas? Or suggest someone they would like to make a card or gift for?
- 4. Talk about the different characters seen in the story and if they are good or bad and how they act in the story e.g. the wolf is usually seen as bad but in the story he is playing games with his friends and being kind.
- 5. Play the board game found in the story.

Outdoors:

- 6. Hide Jolly Christmas Postman Envelopes around the outdoor area. Encourage the children to work as a team to find them.
- 7. . Encourage children to role play being postal workers and deliver post to each other.

Physical Development

Provision:

- 1. Themed play-dough mats.
- 2. Play-dough snowman.
- 3. Christmas present wrapping.

Adult-led:

- 4. Move like the different characters in the story.
- 5. Make your Christmas wish list.
- 6. Christmas salt dough decorations

Outdoors:

- 7. Use the bikes to deliver letters.
- 8. What's the time Mr Wolf?
- Christmas music playing outside for the children to explore movement.
- Draw on frosty ground with paintbrushes dipped in salt.

Adult-led:

- 4. Read some Christmas Cracker Jokes with the children!
- 5. Show and tell—favourite toys.

6. Post Office and Santa's workshop role-play.
