PSE

Provision:

- Encourage children to make Thank You Cards for someone who has helped them.
- 2. Introduce helpful monitors in class eg milk, fruit, chairs use the 'Being Helpful' song as an introduction.
- 3. Put bandages on a doll/soft toy and ask the children to look after it.

Adult-led:

- 4. Talk about the different types of people who can help us with different problems
- 5. Talk to the children about different methods of keeping safe at the setting for example fire practices, safety notices and fire alarms.

Outdoors:

Make a help desk with a notepad and pens and encourage children to take turns in being the helper who decides how to help someone and the person asking for help.

Physical Development

Provision:

- 1. Themed cutting sheets
- 2. Neon yellow play-dough and themed play-dough mats.
- 3. Make themed coned people.

Adult-led:

- 4. People Who Help Us movement game eg. Climb ladders like fire fighters.
- 5. Coastguard rescue finger gym activity.
- Keeping everyone safe in the classroom activity eg using scissors; climbing; building tall towers etc.

Outdoors:

- 7. Spray bottles to put out chalk fire.
- 8. Fire Fighter foam finger gym.

Speech, Language

and Communication

Provision:

- 1. Role-play masks and props
- 2. People who Help Us puppets

Adult-led:

- 3. Share the People Who Help Us posters and encourage the children to make links to their own experiences.
- 4. Share 'The Barney and the Dave' story encouraging the children to ask and answer questions.

Outdoors:

5. Set up scenarios / accidents outside and encourage the children to become the different emergency services.

Outdoors:

Understanding the World

Provision:

- 1. Make props to support children with their role-play
- 2. Play themed interactive games.
- Boats in the water area to support understanding of coast guards.

Adult-led:

- 4. Take the children's finger prints to show how the police catch the criminals.
- 5. Play 'Who is it?' game
- 6. Share People Who Help Us themed video to show the children the different jobs .
