

Key Knowledge

- The Tudor period is the period in England 1485 to 1603
- The Tudor period began when they won the War of the Roses in 1485
- There were 6 different Monarchs in the Tudor Period (Henry VII, Henry VIII, Edward VI, Mary I and Elizabeth I and Lady Jane Grey who ruled for just 9 days)
- Elizabeth had no children, so when she died the Tudor period ended
- Henry VIII set up the Church of England
- In the Tudor period England changed from a Catholic country to a protestant one.
- Henry had different 6 wives whilst he was King (Catherine of Aragon, Anne Boleyn, Jane Seymore, Anne of Cleves, Catherine Howard and Catherine Parr)
