KEY FACTS:

Stockbridge Village, previously Cantril Farm opened to residents in 1960. There have been many changes within this time to make it a safer, more accessible place to live.

Catherine (Kitty) Wilkinson, moved to Liverpool from Ireland when she was 8 years old.

Known as 'Saint of the Slums', Kitty was responsible for the idea of the 'wash house', which led to the first one opening in Fredrick Street, Liverpool.

Kitty played a vital part in slowing down the spread of cholera in Liverpool, by teaching people about cleanliness and hygiene.

Noel Godfrey Chavasse was the only soldier to receive two Victoria Crosses in the First World War. He moved to Liverpool with his family when he was 16.

Joseph Williamson, helped the poor, unemployed people of Liverpool by paying them to dig tunnels (The Williamson's Tunnels)

1965

First homes occupied on Cantril Farm

1968

St Albert's and St Brigid's schools opened

1970

The Withens Shopping Centre opens

1971

The first Cantril Farm library opens

1983

Cantril Farm changed to Stockbridge Village

2010

Regeneration of Stockbridge Village begins
