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Our plans for September

The Government will undoubtedly be making announcements over the next few days and it is likely that Step 4, will take place on Monday 19th July 2021. Most schools will have finished for the summer holidays but for those who are still in school, changes will not take effect until we return in September 2021. It is great news for September and although we still need to be cautious this is a positive step towards the long awaited 'normality'. As we have learnt this year and last, we will need to be flexible with any approaches that are re-introduced and of course, have a back-up plan ready if needed.

Please see below for some planned changes for September

Drop Off - we will continue with the system that we currently have with children being dropped off at their assigned gates. Staggered times will continue but children who have been arriving at 9am will move to 8.55 slot. This system has worked marvellously with children becoming more independent and parents valuing the system as it allows them to safely drop and run.

<u>Pick Up -</u> we will revert back to allowing parents to come onto the school premises and pick children up outside of their classroom doors. This will be 3.15pm for all. This allows parents to have some contact with staff, for school to reduce the number of staff manning the gates and also for us to move the school day back to 3.15pm.

Lunch Times – we will revert to 3 slots one for Rec and Ksl, one for Y3 and 4 and one for Year 5 and 6. Once again this system has many benefits for the children.

<u>Bubbles</u> - We will continue to protect these as much as possible but there will be some movements between bubbles allowed.

<u>Assemblies</u> - these will be re-introduced in September but will be split between KSI and KS2

Face Coverings – this will not be mandatory but will still be encouraged if necessary or needed. Staff will be able to choose in relation to this.

Isolating- Children will be required to isolate if they test positive or have symptoms as there is no change to the positive case procedure or symptomatic procedure.

The biggest difference will be to bubbles no longer needing to isolate if a positive case is identified. This will have a significant impact upon us all and enable us to keep children in school. This is reliant upon parents testing children when notified via a PCR but they will no longer have to isolate as a matter of course.

PE Kits we will continue to wear PE to school on our scheduled PE days. Once again this has worked well and increased the amount of time that we can spend on PE activities. Please see previous page for new PE kit information

All of the above will be included in our updated risk assessment and you will receive more information in September upon our return. In the interim, however, it is looking positive.

We now need to focus on catch up and ensuring that our children make up for lost time so that we can minimise the long term effects. Parental support and involvement has never been more important than it is now. Parents who

place a high priority on their child's learning will be helping their child enormously hence our summer learning project. Please make sure that this features in your child's summer activities
