



Remote Learning 2021-2022 **Guide for Parents / Carers**

What 'Remote Learning' can I expect from St. Albert's Catholic Primary School?

This information is a general guide for parents/ carers. More specific details of remote learning for each year group, will be communicated through **Tapestry** or **Seesaw** daily.

There are 3 general scenarios outlined below:

- **SCENARIO 1** Child awaiting a PCR test result
- **SCENARIO 2** Individual isolation after a positive PCR result
- **SCENARIO 3** Class/school closure

Circumstance	For 'Remote Learning' refer to the school website, under the 'Home Learning' tab. Classes should also refer to their learning platform (Tapestry/ Seesaw).
<u>SCENARIO 1</u> Individual awaiting a PCR test result	<p>The school will have been informed if a child is absent due to awaiting a test result. <u>SCENARIO 2</u> Individual/Family isolation due to a positive case – the rest of the class are attending school and being taught as normal.	<p>If your child tests positive with COVID, your child's teacher will communicate with your child via Seesaw/Tapestry and will direct them towards appropriate work aligned as closely as possible to their class work.</p> <p><u>For example:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Maths lessons – Children will be directed to their platforms where they can access White Rose or Oak National Academy lessons linked to the weekly objectives. The children will be expected to practice their number facts weekly using TTRS (Years 3-6) and Numbots (Year 1-3). EYFS children's learning will be supported through 'Busy Things'. English lessons –Through Seesaw, pupils will be directed to a task as closely aligned to their classwork. Nursery and Reception children will access the 'Busy Things' website, completing suggested activities. Children are expected to read every day and can access free eBooks at https://stalbertsprimary.eplatform.co/ or school reading books, using the 'Oxford Owl' website. Children in Reception and Years 1 and 2 also have logins for the 'Teach your Monster to Read' website. Spellings - Years 1-6, will be set weekly spelling activities on 'Spelling Shed.' Phonics - Children will be directed to activities on Seesaw; they also have free access to 'Oxford Owl' for Phonics eBooks. Nursery and Reception will access Phonics through 'Busy Things', with direction from their teacher. Topic Lessons - Suggested 'topic' learning and resources will be found on <u>Seesaw/Tapestry</u>.
<u>SCENARIO 3</u> My child's class cannot attend school because there are too many positive cases in their bubble.	<p><u>As above, plus additional Support:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Your child's teacher will deliver live teaching sessions via zoom daily for Maths and English and provide daily check-ins. Parents and children can access the school website for extra resources across the curriculum. http://www.stalbertsprimary.co.uk/home-learning/ <p style="text-align: center;">Teachers will contact children daily via Seesaw/Tapestry and give feedback.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> If your child receives this in school, a programme of support will be set up. This may include phone calls / video chats with your child's 1:1 support. They will also be expected to access the online programmes to support their learning which they have been given individual logins for: IDL and Nessy. www.nessy.com www.idlsgroup.com
