
Refugee Week EVERY MIGRANT HAS A NAME, A FACE AND A STORY Friday 23rd June 4-5pm, online

Financina the Parish

I mentioned a couple of months ago about different ways of making your contribution to the parish. Thank you to those of you who took out standing order forms, and made the arrangements with their banks. Some of you have


used text giving, which I appreciate it, and I also mentioned I am looking at getting a card reader. I have been in touch with the diocese on 3 occasions ,asking for a card reader, and for a third time I have been told they will order one for me. Once I get it, I will let you know and for those who wish to contribute by card, you will be able to do so.

Hift aid

Another way of helping the parish financially, is to gift aid. If you are a tax payer, we can claim 25p from the Government on every £1 you donate. So if you give £1 a week(£52 a year), with gift aid your donation becomes £65; £5 a week (£260) a year, with gift aid becomes £325, and £10 a week (£520 a year) with gift aid becomes £650. And all it takes is for you to sign a form and take a box of offertory envelopes, unless you have a standing order, so we can record your donations. Gift aid forms are available at the back of church.
