



Knowsley Deanery Synodal Council Letter on Family of Churches

Dear Parishioners,

Some months ago, the Archbishop made a request to all Parish Priests from across the Archdiocese of Liverpool for a lay person from each parish in their area to be a representative who would become a member of their local 'Deanery Synodal Council'. These representatives have been meeting since April 2023 to talk about key issues within our Knowsley Deanery parishes (Kirkby, Huyton, Prescot) and to begin to think about planning for the future.

The Archbishop has now asked each 'Deanery Synodal Council' to try to identify what are being called, "families of parishes." These would be groups of parishes that could work together and support each other more closely. The idea is to begin to share the different resources of each individual parish more within each wider 'family', so that we can all operate more effectively and be more supportive and responsive across each parish's 'family'. For example, priests giving their support, with the support of the lay people within their parishes, and sharing other resources such as administrative help, buildings, and facilities etc between the parishes within their 'family'. By working collaboratively and combining some of our efforts together we would hope that the energy and vitality of the Catholic faith will be preserved and renewed and that parishes will remain a focal point in the community, spreading the Good News of Jesus Christ.

This is not about closing Churches. But, as an example, not every parish has its own meeting rooms, or enough sacramental preparation groups, or catechists, or SVP members or prayer groups helpers, but some of these things could be organised for groups of parishes and meetings and groups might for example happen at one of the Parish meeting rooms rather than try to arrange in each separate parish.

Looking to have new buildings constructed or developed in one parish would need to be considered in the light of the needs of the wider area of the family of parishes and deanery parishes and the wider needs and annual financial demands across all the parishes of the archdiocese. Decisions about the repair of Churches and all other parish buildings, Presbyteries, Halls etc are ultimately taken by the Archbishop and the archdiocesan authorities. From time to time the costs of these repairs may lead the archdiocese to limit the level of repairs or if the needs of wider 'family' change, they then may decide some of the buildings at some of the parishes are too expensive to fully maintain, particularly if there are suitable alternatives in the wider 'family of parishes'.

We understand that this might seem uncomfortable and even unwelcome for some people. However, the reality is that as fewer people attend Mass and it becomes harder to get volunteers to support the work of the Church, we have to be more realistic, and parishes will have to adapt in order to be able to continue to serve their communities well. Our Knowsley Deanery Synodal Council has recently identified that, as a starting point, a sensible approach could be groupings of parishes which make some sort of geographical sense for our own, "families of parishes," . This will need to be approved by the Archbishop, but provisionally the Knowsley Synodal Council have proposed the following three groups of 'families of parishes' at a recent meeting of the Archdiocese Synodal Council held on 25th November 2023:

More information will be shared in the coming months and there will be more discussions before these proposals lead to any changes in your area.
