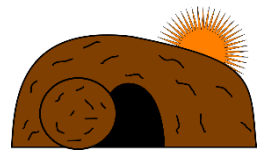

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MMR Vaccinations

There are concerns about a potential measles outbreak in Knowsley. As we live in a community where the number of unvaccinated children is very high. There is a call to encourage families to vaccinate their children as soon as possible. There will be a Livewell Bus in Stockbridge Village (Leach Croft) offering vaccinations on Thursday 14th March which is easily accessible. If there is an outbreak, unvaccinated children may be asked to isolate for 21 days and this would be a concern. There is also pop-ups MMR clinics taking place in Knowsley to help get as many children as possible vaccinated. No appointment is needed. Please see clinics timetable.



Pop-up MMR clinics are taking place in Knowsley to help get as many children as possible vaccinated against Measles, Mumps and Rubella.

No appointment is needed. Just turn up to get your child's vaccination.

Measles is highly contagious amongst those who are unvaccinated.

Parents can check their child's red book to see if they are up to date with their vaccination or contact their GP if they are unsure.
