
KEY VOCABULARY

Medium	the type of art and the materials used to create it
Architecture	the art or practice of designing and <u>constructing</u> buildings.
Structure	a building or other object constructed from several parts.
Scale	how big or small something appears compared to other things in the artwork and in relation to the human eye.
Line	a fundamental mark or stroke that defines the shape, contour, or outline of a form " and can convey motion, direction, or emotion.
Form	three-dimensional objects that possess height, width, and depth, creating volume and a sense of space.
Foam board	a lightweight and easily cut material.

Inspirational Artists




Phil Dean (AKA Shoreditch Sketcher) is well-known for his urban sketches from around the world.




Types of Lines in Art

Vertical Line




Horizontal Line

Diagonal Line




Wavy Line



Dashed Line




Dotted Line
