A reflection on today's Gospel

In today's Gospel, Jesus offers practical wisdom for dealing with conflict within the Christian community. His concern is not punishment or winning an argument, but reconciliation. The goal is clear: "If he listens to you, you have gained your brother."

Christ's desire is always to restore relationships rather than break them apart.

Too often, when someone hurts us, our first instinct is to complain to others, harbour resentment, or simply walk away. Jesus proposes a different path. He asks us to approach the person directly, with honesty and charity. Such conversations are rarely easy. They require humility, patience, and courage. Yet they reflect the way God himself deals with us, always calling us back to communion rather than abandoning us because of our failures.

The Gospel also reminds us that faith is never purely individual. We belong to a community, the Church, where we support one another in the journey of discipleship. When difficulties arise, we are called to seek truth and healing together, trusting in the wisdom and guidance of the Christian family.

Jesus then gives a beautiful promise: "Where two or three are gathered in my name, there am I among them." The Lord is present whenever believers come together in prayer, worship, and genuine efforts at reconciliation. His presence gives us hope that even wounded relationships can be healed.

Today, we might ask ourselves whether there is someone with whom we need to seek peace. By taking the first step towards forgiveness and understanding, we become instruments of Christ's mercy, and in doing so, we truly gain a brother or sister for the Kingdom of God.

From Father Mike... ETHIOPIA EMERGENCY APPEAL

As many of you know Fr Michael spent a few months working with CAFOD in the Tigray region of Ethiopia back in 2005 mainly supporting a project working with street children but also visiting other CAFOD supported projects on health, water and farming. He has been back to visit friends and the CAFOD projects in Ethiopia several times since his initial time there. He worked closely with the sisters of the Daughters of Charity - the same order who ran Christopher Grange nursing home here in our area.

Sadly recently there has been a terrible conflict and war in Tigray an although there is an uneasy peace now the scars of war and the threat of renewed fighting is not far away. Added to this is the ongoing impact of climate change has caused a significant drought. Local crops have failed and the water levels have dropped to a critical level.

Over 10 years of positive development have been wiped out by war and climate change. And, as ever, this impacts most on our poorest sisters and brothers around the world. The situation in Tigray is now critical and famine is now a real threat and possibility. Official agencies have given a six week notice for urgent intervention.

Because the Daughters of Charity are already rooted in these villages, their teams can deliver help immediately without administrative delays. With support, they intend to:-

- * Repair broken water wells and install solar pumps for rural clinics, schools, and villages.
- * Distribute emergency nutrition directly to young children and pregnant or nursing mothers.
- * Provide drought-resistant seeds and livestock feed so farmers can stay on their land and plant again.

We are asking if you would consider giving some support to this emerging crisis. The Sisters are trusted partners and we can get the money to them within the next few weeks.

We will hold an emergency additional second collection next week, please donate if you are able, and keep the people of Tigray and the sisters in your prayers at this sad time.
